



Conwy Connect Annual Review Day

A focus session was held on 17th August 2017 which started the process of looking at the 10 questions of the PQASSO elements of self assessment. Chris Spree facilitated and actions were drawn up.

PQASSO Essentials is the National Council for Voluntary Organisation's (NCVO) self-assessment tool that helps third sector organisations take a systematic look at what they do, identify areas where they are doing well and not so well, and decide exactly where improvements are needed. Developed in 1997, for and by third sector organisations, it is a tried and tested approach to quality assurance and management in the third sector.

Connect Forum/Connect Advocacy Group

Things the Connect Forum spoke about were:

- Transport Eligibility within Conwy County Council
- the Citizen Panel, and also our opinion on a leaflet the health board were in the middle of producing
- National Council Feedback and Conference
- Conwy County Council Website
- Training with All Wales People First Group to feedback
- How we want our Regional Voice to be heard
- Mencap legal toolkit and the WISE project



In January the group decided to change their name to Conwy Self Advocacy Group. The things they spoke about were:

- Re-established the group, group rules and how they want it to run
- Feedback on Learning Disability Strategy event
- Conversations around work opportunities



Regional and National Council

Cath supported Debbie and Sheila in taking part in a Regional event at The Interchange on 29th March 2017. They spoke about their relationships.





The Connect Advocacy Group, whose members are representatives of Service Members groups, has continued to meet on a monthly basis.





Things we have spoken about are:

- Name change of the group
- Encouraging new members to join
- Ground rules for meetings
- Chair to be chosen at each meeting (to give each member a chance to chair)
- Icebreaker at the beginning of each meeting
- Group would prefer to be called 'service members' rather than 'service users'
- Continued discussions on how to progress from voluntary positions to paid employment. This led to an event in April called 'To Work or Not to Work'
- Number 12 Bus was brought onto the agenda as standing item

Reports and newsletters are regularly produced. Connect Advocacy Group minutes are recorded in an easy read format after each meeting. These are then posted out along with the agenda to the members for the next meeting.



Regional Participation Meetings/Events



Regional meetings were held at Llys Elian in January. Reps reviewed options of moving forward with a co-ordinator.

Shayna was asked to represent the group and give the feedback to the Regional Partnership Meeting. Michelle also gave a joint presentation with Joe Powell about why Self Advocacy is so important and how it should be funded through the Local Authority.







Big Regional Event Colwyn Bay Cricket Club 22nd February

Tracey Drew asked Michelle Williams and Katherine Watchorn to co-chair the meeting.

In the morning the meeting looked at options of how and where the Regional Co-ordinator was to be appointed and who that would be.

Feedback from the Connect Advocacy group felt that the morning was good and productive.



In the afternoon, Alaw Pierce and Dr Alan Dowey came to talk about and show the draft version of the North Wales Learning Disability Strategy Easy Read Version.

Feedback from the Connect Advocacy group was given by Debbie Lomas at the L.D.P.G.




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Connect Buddies

Alison Fletcher Connect Buddies Co-ordinator

My role as Connect Buddies Co-ordinator is funded by the Gwynt Y Mor Community Fund. I develop and sustain the service of Connect Buddies. It involves supporting individuals with a learning disability and volunteers to pair up and take part in social and community activities.



This year we have focused on 3 main areas of work:

- Recruiting volunteers
- Matching buddies and volunteers
- Promoting the service







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Connect Buddies

Recruiting volunteers

Connect Buddies matches up buddies with volunteers who have the same interests.

They then do things together at times that suit them.

Volunteers make Connect Buddies happen! We have been working with local volunteer organisations and community networks to tell people about volunteering with us.

Connect Buddies recruited 12 volunteers in the first year of the service. But we need more volunteers to meet the demand for the service, so volunteer recruitment will remain a priority.

We have taken our information stand out to shopping centres and community events and we use social media to raise the profile of volunteering with Connect Buddies.

We have used a range of activities to promote the Connect Buddies Service this year, taking opportunities to have information stands and talk about the service and volunteering.



Paul Carter Health Improvement Co-ordinator

My post started in September 2013. I work 15 hours a week as Health Improvement Co-ordinator for Conwy Connect. My role is to work alongside the Learning Disability Acute Liaison Team nurses to provide support to reduce health inequalities which may experienced by adults with learning disabilities. The Health Improvement Service is funded by the Betsi Cadwaladr Health Board.



Due to an extended period of illness in late 2017 and early 2018, some of my duties as Health Improvement Co-ordinator were carried out by other members of the Conwy Connect team in my absence.

- Leaflet was completed and launched at our Annual General Meeting on 29th November 2017 by Nia Thomas of Public Health Wales

Continued work to promote Welsh Annual Learning Disability Health Checks

- I have continued to work to encourage people to attend their checks by telling them about 'Your Guide To Your Health Check' – an Easy Read leaflet I adapted for North Wales from a Mencap guide for English health checks
- It is available online and at Conwy Connect events
- Adults with a learning disability in Wales can have a free annual health check
- It is important as it can pick up underlying health problems
- Less than half the people who are eligible for a check actually have one
- As a result of the Task And Finish Group about Health Checks last year which I was part of, people will once again be sent a letter from social services to remind them to have a health check

Medical Student Sessions



This initiative was introduced by Conwy Connect with the aim of improving communication between people with a learning disability and their families and carers with the medical students. It has continued during the past nine years with funding from the Health Authority. We facilitated 5 sessions during 2017/18.

What happens in a session?

- Parents, carers and occasionally siblings talk to medical students about their experiences with GPs, hospital staff and other medical personnel
- The sessions have been well attended by students who have given positive feedback
- The main aim was to help improve medical students understanding of the additional challenges facing people with a learning disability and their parents and carers in accessing medical care

We are very grateful to those parents and carers who give their time to attend the sessions. They are helping to mould the next generation of health care professionals.

We are always looking for new parents/carers to share their experiences.
